Disaster Supply Kit Checklist

GENERAL

- Flashlight
- Cash
- Radio
- List and photos of personal contents
- Set of car, house, and office keys
- Seasonal or rain gear, and sturdy shoes or boots

FOOD

- Non-electric can opener
- Paper plates
- Napkins
- Plastic cups
- Utensils
- Water (1gal per person)

Enough food for at least seven (7) days, nonperishable packaged or canned food and beverages, snacks foods, juices, baby food, and any special dietary items.

PET CARE ITEMS

- Pet food and water
- Proper identification
- A carrier or crate
- Muzzle and leash
- Water and food bowls
- Medications
- Supplies for your service dog

EXTRAS

- Books and activities for children
- Diapers and wipes
- Extra batteries
- Matches (in a waterproof container)

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

- Insurance cards
- Medical records
- Bank numbers
- Credit card numbers
- Copy of Social Security card
- Copies of birth and/or marriage certificate
- Service animal ID, veterinary records, and microchip information
- Copy of will

FIRST AID / MEDICAL

- Antiseptic
- Scissors
- Tweezers
- Sewing needle
- Triangular bandages
- Hypoallergenic adhesive tape
- First aid manual
- Sterile gauze pads
- Sterile adhesive bandages
- Moistened towelettes
- Medications
- Thermometer
- Tube of petroleum jelly
- Safety pins
- Soap
- Latex gloves
- Sunscreen
- Pain reliever
- Anti-diarrheal medicine
- Antacid
- Laxative
- Cotton balls and Q-tips

Make sure to have at least two weeks supply of medication, medical supplies used regularly, and a list of all allergies. Also include a list of the style, serial number, and manufacturer information of required medical devices.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Disasters happen anytime, anywhere. When disaster does strike you may not have much time to respond, so it is essential to prepare before an event.

Be aware of the hazards in your community and how to react if things go wrong. A highway spill of hazardous material could mean instant evacuation or shelter in place.

A winter storm could confine your family at home. An earthquake, flood, a wildfire could cut off essential services – gas, water, electricity, and telephone – for days or even weeks.
